

1. INCOME REPLACEMENT – Contribution Based

Employment Insurance (EI) – <u>regular</u> benefits

- Patient has to have worked a minimum amount of hours (600) over the last year
- 55 % of your weekly income to a maximum of \$413
- Must be ready and able to work

1. INCOME REPLACEMENT – Contribution Based

Employment Insurance (EI) – <u>sickness</u> benefits

- Patient has to have worked a minimum amount of hours (600) over the last year
- Patient will require medical confirmation of an inability to work
- Maximum 15 weeks of payment,
 2 week waiting period
- takes 6 weeks to receive payment
- Not retroactive
- Minimum 4 week turnaround for updated medical information (indefinite, or max time off)

1. INCOME REPLACEMENT – Contribution Based

Employment Insurance (EI) – <u>compassionate</u> <u>care</u> benefits

- For family members of patient with a prognosis of less than 6 months.
- applicant has to have worked a minimum amount of hours (600) over the last year to qualify
- The applicant will require medical confirmation of patient's prognosis.
- Maximum 6 weeks, 4 week waiting period

1. INCOME REPLACEMENT - Asset Based

Ontario Works (OW)

- Patient has to meet financial need criteria to qualify
- Patient may receive income replacement, drug coverage, emergency dental coverage, transportation for medical appointments, a diet allowance, and assistance with purchasing equipment (eg. wheelchair)

1. INCOME REPLACEMENT - Asset Based

- Patient has to meet financial need criteria to qualify
- Patient will require medical confirmation of diagnosis and functional limitations
- Patient may receive income replacement, drug coverage, standard dental coverage, transportation for medical appointments, and a diet allowance

1. INCOME REPLACEMENT – Employer Based

Short Term Disability (STD) Benefits

Long Term Disability (LTD) Benefits

- Some employers offer a STD or LTD as part of their benefit package.
- If employed, patients can contact their department of human resources or union for more information and/or for an application package.

- a non-refundable tax credit that reduces the amount of income tax a person may have to pay
- Patient's medical prognosis and function should reflect a disability that markedly restricts patient's ability to perform basic activities of daily living on a prolonged basis.

- a non-refundable tax credit for people who are spending 3 % of their Net Income or \$1884, whichever is less, on medical expenses.
- Some allowable expenses include:
 - Assistive devices
 - Related travel expenses
 - Eyeglasses, dentures, prescription drugs
 - Air conditioning
- Some expenses may require physician confirmation

3. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

CANADA PENSION PLAN (CPP)

 Can apply as early as age 60, but pension amount will be reduced

- Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS)



- helps families in need by paying past-due rent or utility bills or other emergency cancer-related expenses
- Up to \$500/year per family
- Applications are made through Social Work and payments are made directly to the Creditor

- Provides a free cottage for one week for people who have completed cancer treatments (\$800 registration fee)
- Cottages are anywhere in Ontario
- Contact Cottage Dreams directly to apply to stay in a cottage or to offer your cottage

MONEY MATTERS 5. DRUG COVERAGE

Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB)



- Covers the cost of most medications prescribed by a physician
- Requires a co-pay
- Available to patients who
 - are 65 and over
 - are in receipt of OW/ODSP
 - require CCAC Nursing or other CCAC Professional services

Trillium Drug Program (TDP)

- Pays a portion of drug costs, not covered by any other plan (i.e private insurance)
- Patient and family will need to submit income information for each dependent family member over 16 who is financially dependent (not necessarily living with the family)

MONEY MATTERS 5. DRUG COVERAGE

Cancer Drug Assistance Program (C-DAP)

- For patients who are having difficulty with approval of some medications or cannot afford the TDP deductible
- Assists with assessing patients' options for drug coverage and facilitating appropriate applications

Power Of Attorney (POA)

 Assigning a POA allows someone to make decisions on your behalf, if you are not capable of doing so



Power Of Attorney (POA) - Personal Care

- POA Personal Care can make decisions regarding your personal care, including medical treatment decisions
- if a POA for personal care is not assigned, the government has established a hierarchy for determining who can serve as a Substitute Decision Maker (SDM)

Power Of Attorney (POA) - Property

- POA Property can make decisions regarding your property or assets
- if a POA has not been assigned, patient's capacity has to be formally assessed
- if patient is deemed incapable, the Public Guardian & Trustee's (PG&T) office becomes Guardian of patient's property

Power Of Attorney (POA)

- POA booklets are available free of charge from the PG&T and require the signature of two witnesses, who are over 16 and are not being assigned the POA. They are legally binding documents once signed.
- Hospital staff cannot serve as witnesses
- POA ceases when patient dies.

Wills

- Establishes what happens to your property and who will be the guardian of minor children in the event of your death
- The government has a process in place for disbursing of property in the event a person dies without a will, however the property is divided according to government rules, and the process is usually very lengthy and costly.

Wills

- Will kits are available from most book or business products stores (eg. Coles, Business Depot)
